PREPARATION: **5** MINUTES range Mug

INGREDIENTS

3 tablespoons all purpose flour 1/s teaspoon baking soda 1 tablespoon white sugar 1 teaspoon orange zest*

1 ½ teaspoons canola oil 2 tablespoons milk 1 tablespoon orange juice ½ teaspoon vanilla extract

you can use lemon and lemon zest instead

PREPARATION

- Spray mug with cooking spray (optional).
- In the mug, sift together the dry ingredients.
- To the dry ingredients, add oil, milk, orange juice and vanilla extract. Whisk until well mixed and free of lumps.
- Place mug in a microwave and cook for approximately minute. The cake should be risen and firm to the touch. Do not overcook. 5 Serve immediately.

Note: Cooking times may vary based on microwave
