END OF THE TERM WRAP UP



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Term 3 is quickly drawing to a close, but we are busy in the swing of preparing for term 4 and also for 2025. On Monday at our Student Free Day staff from the school will spend the day creating greater understanding of the SA Public Education Strategy and also the new SA Curriculum. Over the past 2 years the Department for Education have spent considerable time capturing the voice of children, parents and educators about what each of these groups of people see important in Public Education. As a result, the strategy has been developed which

highlights 4 key areas of impact which have been highlighted as critical areas for schools to focus their attention on.

Further to this, a SA version of the Australian curriculum is currently being adapted from the Australian Curriculum which supports the learning for SA children. The focus of the SA curriculum is on developing knowledge and conceptual understanding adapted from the Australian Curriculum, while also focusing on developing the learning capabilities and dispositions for learners to be able to then apply learning to all contexts in life. Schools have been allocated 2 extra SFD from 2025 to 2029 to engage with and enact the education strategy and plan for the full adoption of the SA curriculum by 2027.

The PAT testing is now almost complete and once again we have seen some absolutely wonderful levels of achievement and growth. In both the reading Comprehension and Numeracy assessments we have 88% of our students above the expected benchmark for their year level, with a significant proportion of the students with exceptionally high scores. With some recent training and development, I have become increasingly interested in rates of growth as it is a much more indicative of individual

development and to some extent their engagement in learning. If you are interested in looking at your child's progress in relation to PAT testing, please reach out to the teacher at the beginning of next term. This will give the teachers a chance to have a good look at and be able to understand your child's results before they discuss them with you.

This required a huge amount of extra organisation from all staff and in particular I say a big thankyou to Kelly Burton for all of the extra time and effort she put into organising the involvement of the Rural Care children.

It has been a great pleasure for me to be able to join some of the visits to the Forest this year. Yesterday, I watched the children exploring and enjoying being in the great outdoors. Things that often seem so small and simple to the adults such as collecting sticks, stones, leaves and flowers are so captivating and exciting for children filling them with curiosity and creativity. For about a 20 minute period, I watched all of the Preschool children play on a large log over the dry creek bed. Some children bloomed with increased confidence as they progressively became more independent walking the length of the log, others quickly moved onto finding and creating a little cave under the log. The time was filled with children taking risks in doing

something different or new, negotiating individual or group challenges, resolving conflict

while also being completely captivated and playing in harmony as a group.

Today we say farewell to Alicia McNeill who has been undertaking her final teaching placement in the Reception, Year 1 class this term. I have been very impressed with the way Alicia has confidentially interacted with the students and the staff in the school. During the placement Alicia has developed confidence in leading the learning in the classroom and the students have been very responsive to her style of teaching. On behalf of all at Laura Primary School, I wish Alicia all the best for her future career as a teacher, I'm sure she will be an asset to the schools she works in.







Year 3 and 4 students travelled to Appila Springs for a fun filled day of learning and exploring.


