PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Hi Everyone,

I would like to start by thanking all of the parents, grandparents and families that joined us last Thursday for the sports day. I think you would all agree that it was a great day and the students definitely put not only a spectacle of performance but also showed great sportspersonship. My most memorable moment for the day was when Jade Smith used her Sonic boosters in the sprint, thanks for making me and lots of others proud. I would like to say a huge thankyou to Sandra for her prior planning and preparation she had put in place as in her absence it was very easy for us as a staff to pick up and run with Without this level of her planning. planning the day would not have run as smoothly as it did. I would also like to say a huge thankyou to all of the staff who picked up the extra duties on the day and also to the year 5/6 students who were very supportive in the setting up and packing up the events.

Last Friday, all LPS staff participated in the first of 4 days of the Berry Street Education Model training. This has been long awaited and our staff have been looking forward to this training since the beginning of the year. The first day was titled 'Body' and was largely focussed on developing positive classroom culture and understanding why children respond the way they do to certain situations. In addition to this we also learnt how we as staff can help students to regulate their emotional responses in order to be in mindset that enables rather than disables learning. At the school we have

already implemented the morning circle to promote a positive start to each day and in staff meeting we have started planning the next steps for the remainder of 2023 and beyond. The early years staff have already completed the equivalent Early Years Berry Street training and the learning from this is currently being implemented at the Preschool Centre. It is exciting that the Berry Street Model will provide us with a common language and a consistent way of supporting children with emotional regulation across the Pre-school/Rural Care and the School.

On Tuesday the members from our Local Education Team (LET) joined us to look at the improvement work we have been doing in the school this year. The team spent the first part of the morning in the classroom, and we then shared some of this year's success stories from the school and preschool. We were commended on our positive connection with students, families and the local community and the fact that the staff show genuine care and concern for the children in our care. Also, that we use data well to measure individual and school progress and that we have some effective literacy processes embedded in the school. Our Literacy Intervention Model was highly regarded by the team and was identified as a model of best practice. We were really pleased with this feedback as this is one area we have invested heavily financially in, and our exceptional educators put a lot of extra time and energy in to support each of the individual students involved.
